The Crawford County Road Commission shall receive sealed bids at their offices at 500 Huron St., Grayling, Michigan 49738 until 4:00 p.m., on April 14, 2022. For furnishing qualified laborers to work on various projects for the Michigan Department of Transportation. Laborers will work under the direction of the Michigan Department of Transportation maintenance forces:

- All-inclusive price per regular labor hour per employee
- All-inclusive price per overtime labor hour per employee.
- Up to 6 (six) qualified laborers.
- Provide requested number of employees 40 hours per work week, typically Monday through Thursday 6:00am to 4:30pm (excluding State of Michigan observed holidays) (hours/days may vary based on workload needs)
- Overtime will be paid on the hours over 40 hours in a week
- Provide All Personal Protective Equipment for each employee.
- Ability to replace an employee upon unsatisfactory conduct or absence.
- Provide a minimum of \$500,000 liability insurance for each occurrence.
- May-1-2022 to September-30-2022
- Vender shall provide detailed time sheets to the road commission on a weekly basis

QUALIFIED LABORER

To be considered a qualified laborer applicants must meet the following:

- Be 18 years of age or older
- Able to work forty (40) hours or more per work week (excluding State of Michigan holidays)
- Possess a valid Michigan Driver's License. (CDL not required, however favorable)
- Possess a valid CDL Medical Examiners Certificate.
- Ability to lift up to 100 pounds.
- Have reliable transportation.
- Able to travel to work sites within the North Region of the Michigan Department of Transportation as required.
- Ability to comprehend and follow all MDOT rules and regulations.
